

School Uniform Policy

Our school uniform ensures that students are smartly dressed while at school and identifies them as members of Poynton High School.

Aims

This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform

Our school's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The [Equality Act 2010](#) prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will:

- Have a gender-neutral uniform code, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in or that most reflects their self-identified gender
- Make sure that our uniform costs the same for all students
- Allow all students to have long hair (though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back for Health and Safety reasons)
- Allow students to request changes to PE kit for religious reasons
- Allow students to wear headscarves and other religious or cultural symbols

Limiting the cost of school uniform

Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory [guidance](#) from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform.

As a school we have completed a review of our uniform and have minimised the number of branded items. Poynton High School will also:

- Complete an annual review with both uniform suppliers to look at cost, longevity of garments.
- Encourage the use of second-hand uniform.
- Ensure parents have access to clear information about uniform policies
- Offer support to pupil premium students

Expectations for our school community

Students are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times while:

- On the school premises
- Travelling to and from school

- At out-of-school events or on trips that are organised by the school, or where they are representing the school (if required)

Parents and carers

Parents and carers are expected to make sure their young person has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that every item is:

- Clean
- Clearly labelled with the child's name

Adjustments to uniform in periods of sustained extreme high temperatures
